Pricing framework

Apportionment of dam safety upgrade capital expenditure

- Proposed approach including treatment of dams with a formal flood mitigation role and treatment of dams that do not have a formal flood mitigation role, but provide informal flood management benefits.
- The use of a regulatory asset base (RAB) approach and how this approach differed from Sunwater's RAB approach.
- The interaction of the RAB and renewals annuity and the approach to allocating future costs between the RAB and the annuity.
- Whether dams were primarily built for the provision of water or for regional development.
